In Case You Missed H...

The following information was sent out previously via a JMC email. In case you missed it, we wanted to include it here:

Dear Parents,

At RLHS our mission is to provide the highest quality education for every student in a responsive and enriching classroom environment. In order to deliver the rigorous academic content all students deserve, we need to ensure a safe and orderly learning environment. As we have turned the corner into Quarter 2, we have noticed an increase in student behaviors that warrant a before/after school detention. As such, I wanted to share out to all parents our detention procedures:

- Detentions will be scheduled Tuesdays from 3:30-4:30 p.m. and Thursdays from 7:00-8:00 a.m.
- Students are required to serve detention within 3 days of it being assigned. As such, a student's detention will always be scheduled for the soonest available time slot.
- Each family is responsible for coordinating transportation to before school detention and home from after school detention for their child.
- Failure to attend detention will result in an increased consequence.

For more information, please review the behavior and attendance policies with your child in the <u>RLHS Handbook</u>. Common reasons students may receive a before/after school detention include:

- · Behavior that disrupts the learning environment
- Repetitive/Habitual Minor Behaviors
- Inappropriate language
- Excessive Tardies

You will be notified via a phone call if your child is assigned a before/after school detention.
